

ACC 547 Academic Honesty Policy

Overview:

Academic misconduct will not be tolerated. Professor Swanquist expects *complete* academic integrity and an “always do the right thing” approach. It is reasonable to assume that individuals who are unethical business students are at high risk of becoming unethical business practitioners. Consequently, our school has an obligation to react swiftly and decisively toward academic dishonesty. The University policy on academic conduct is detailed here:

Whistleblower Policy:

You are expected to report all actual and suspected misconduct. This whistleblower policy is critical so that you can help ensure the integrity and fairness of this course for everyone. Reports of misconduct will remain confidential. If you ever have any questions about what is right or wrong, please ask immediately. Never guess or assume anything.

Agreement:

I understand that I am *not* allowed to give, share, or receive *unauthorized* assistance on *any* individual assignments, quizzes, or tests.

Terms defined:

Give—includes sharing (by any means) of your work or any course materials. This also includes sharing knowledge of test material with other students in any class, section, or academic term. This includes, but is not limited to, informing other students of the type of questions on an exam/quiz, the topics covered on an exam/quiz, your memory of specific questions on an exam/quiz, or answers you provided on an exam/quiz. You are also explicitly prohibited from recording any information from an exam, whether written or electronic (e.g., take a picture with your phone) for any reason.

Share—includes, but is not limited to, word of mouth, maintaining archives of course material or solutions for use by other students, passing notes, or uploading any course content to websites other than Blackboard.

Receive—includes, but is not limited to, asking for or receiving: notes, work, or knowledge related to any exams or assignments in this course.

Unauthorized—any giving, sharing, or receiving of course content, unless explicitly approved by Professor Swanquist, is prohibited.
